Distinguished panelists include:

- **Kate Brannen (C'02)** is a Nonresident Senior Fellow at the Brent Scowcroft Center on International Security at the Atlantic Council, and a freelance reporter focusing on national security. She was previously a senior reporter at *Foreign Policy* and has worked at outlets including *Politico* and *Defense News*.
- **August Cole (C'97)** is an author and analyst specializing in national security issues who directs the Art of the Future of War project at the Atlantic Council. His book, "Ghost Fleet: A Novel of the Next World War," co-written with P.W. Singer, is a future-war thriller about the U.S.-China rivalry. He was previously a reporter for the *Wall Street Journal* and *MarketWatch.com*.
- **Yochi Dreazen (C'99)** is the managing editor for news at *Foreign Policy*. His book, "The Invisible Front: Love and Loss in the Era of Endless War," was picked as one of The New York Times's Notable Books of 2014 and one of Amazon's Best Books of 2014. Before joining *Foreign Policy*, he spent 11 years at the *Wall Street Journal*, most recently as a military correspondent.
